

NRW wins \$620 million contract for Roy Hill

Company signs earthworks contract for heavy haul rail line

Earthworks company NRW Holdings Limited signs a \$620 million contract with EPC contractors Samsung C&T Corporation to move 10.5 million cubic metres of material on its Port Hedland rail line.

NRW CEO Jules Pemberton says rail earthworks construction forms a core part of the company's civil business.

The mine, owned by Australia's richest woman Gina Rinehart, will produce 55Mt of iron ore worth US\$10 billion once production starts in 2015.

"We are proud to be involved in the construction of the major infrastructure on this significant Australian iron ore project," Pemberton says.

The scope of works for the NRW contract includes construction and earthworks for 330 kilometres of heavy haul rail line from the Roy Hill mine site to Port Hedland.

It will also include sidings, level crossings and other associated works.

Preliminary construction for the project will commence in September 2013 and will employ up to 1500 people at its peak.

"We look forward to working alongside Samsung C&T and the Roy Hill team to deliver a world class outcome."
